SENATOR SCHROCK: Take the cigarette money and give it to the parks.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well, right now, the Game and Parks does get one cent tax on cigarettes for park fee...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, give them another.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...but it's not for park fees.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If they get another.

SENATOR SCHROCK: I...that sounds like a reasonable proposal, Senator Chambers. I'm not ready to commit on it just now, but it's something I would...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I want you to just think about it.

SENATOR SCHROCK: All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let me ask you something else, because I've been doing some calculating here too, but I won't give you the amounts because they're approximations and I don't know what the increase is going to be. Why don't you have a resident fee and a nonresident fee for those who come to the parks? Since people have talked about tourism, which relates to people from outside the state, why don't you have a nonresident park fee?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Chambers, we do vehicles, not people. We could probably have a different fee for out-of-state plates versus a fee for in-state plates. We wouldn't know, if you come to visit your friends, I'm sure your friends would take you and use their vehicle. I think that's done now because the resident is most likely to have a fee. I understand in states they've done that, that has not been real successful, but I will explore that opening with you, if you would like for me to do that.
