SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Thank you. That's all I will ask you. In the meantime, I've got to wage my battle and continue the struggle as though nothing is going to be worked out here. What I must do on this bill is to show my seriousness of intent, try to make it clear the people whose interests I have at heart to the greatest extent. And if the people I'm concerned about can be sacrificed because...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ... a vast...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Your light is next and this will be your third time, Senator Chambers, outside of closing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Gotcha. Thank you, Mr. President. If the people that I'm concerned about can be sacrificed on this issue because the majority of the senators don't have the same feeling for them that I have, they've got to understand that when issues come up that mean something to them, and I don't care about those issues like they do, they're going to have me to contend with in the same way that I have them to contend with now and they're doing everything they can to defeat the welfare or the interests of the people about whom I'm concerned. Fair is fair. Tit for tat, measure for measure, even-steven, I will have to do to their interests what they're doing to mine. And people may not be aware of the significance of that right now, but I will tell them when that day comes that I warned you but you weren't paying attention. But you're going to see the reality now, not just as a warning, but we'll see if I can deliver on what I'm promising. There are ways to get money for these parks other than by raising these fees. The symbolism of doing this at this point, when there might be more people turning to the parks because there are not other opportunities, makes me realize that we ought not do this. Several have said this is the best bargain you can find. Senator Schimek compared the cost of this, even with the fee increase, to a family going to a movie. Maybe the family can't go to a movie. Maybe they'll go to a park. And maybe they think they're going to go more than one day. Maybe something happens and they cannot, but instead of buying entry for \$2.50, which is what the increase lowering the
