SENATOR SCHROCK: I think that would be available.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And at some point I would appreciate it if you could get that for us, and I don't think it's unreasonable to ask for that. And I would like it if we can get it for the last five years. Then we can get an idea of trends, if there are any,...

SENATOR SCHROCK: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...in terms of the number of vehicles coming, whether that number is diminishing or increasing. If the number is increasing...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...we know they're getting more money. If it's diminishing, then they probably are going to ask us to let them raise the fee even more to make up for the people who no longer are coming, but that will be something we'll have to determine. The time this morning is not going to give you the opportunity to get that kind of information, so I'm not even going to pursue that from the standpoint of a discussion, but it's information I would like to have. I do believe that this park system that they have now could continue at the level it is without raising these fees. If you let them know they can get more money, they're going to take more money. It's like the prisons. If you build them, they'll fill them. But if you don't build them, then they find a way to make do with what they've got, and not always by overcrowding. With this park situation, I would even want to know how many times they mow these parks. If they mowed one time fewer,...
