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any purpose from the cigarette tax money than could be found for other uses. I don't know how willing I would be to increase the cigarette tax if all the money went into the General Fund, because then it loses its identity; it's lost. There ceases to be a relationship between the substance that generates that money and the usage to be made of the tax derived from sale of that product. I've got to just plow along for awhile and see if I can bring the body to a realization, first of all, that these park fees should not be increased. But if they're going to be increased, again, don't talk about \$20. The \$2.50 is probably all they ought to get. Leave the annual fee where it is or maybe raise the annual fee by a dollar and don't raise the daily fee at all. I would like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question, if I may.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Wehrbein, to a question?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes. Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, do you have that page that you were showing me in what somebody referred to as...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, and this is yours, Senator Chambers. I'm going to bring it down to you. It will be your personal copy. I'm not going to autograph it, but...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, thank you very much. Would you find that page, though, so I can ask you for the record, since I was touching on that, how many vehicles or permits,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...however they phrase it?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It's park entry permits sold.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: 1999-2000 was 479,425; 2000-2001 was 485,190. It's about a half a million. Actual in 2001-02 was 473,892, and
