SENATOR SCHROCK: That would be correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: In other words, the money derived from a park is not dedicated to that park, but it's spread around to be used wherever it's necessary in the system in general.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yeah, most of their parks are losers. I do think Mahoney State Park is one of the winning parks they have as far as profit, but most of the parks are losing propositions for them.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And where would the parks be located in an area of the state that lose the least, if such a determination can be made?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I could only speculate, Senator Chambers, and, rather than say, I'd rather not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's okay, because we can get to that later too, can't we?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Sure.
