plates: Massachusetts, Indiana, Delaware, and Wisconsin. But one of our neighboring states, Wyoming, charges \$25 for an annual fee, but if you're an out-of-state vehicle, they charge \$40. The number that was tossed around a little bit yesterday is that an out-of-state plated vehicle, they might want to charge them \$5 for a daily fee, and \$25 for an annual fee. But we are working with the Game and Parks. And if we do that, we will offer it on Select File. If it would become controversial, I would not pursue it. But the amendment that you have in front of you today would strike the number "four" and insert the number "three" so that the daily fee would not exceed \$3. I appreciate Senator Chambers' cooperation with this situation. Senator Chambers, did you hear that? I appreciate your cooperation on this situation. I'm looking forward to moving this bill forward and working with you in the future. Thank you.
