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listening to this discussion, and I think about everything has been answered on it. But I want to stand up and support this amendment, because I don't think we can have anything any clearer than that they got this amendment wrote here. And like Senator Baker said, the word "functional" means that it's part of your operation out there, and that that's where you actually live and that's how you operate your farm. Now, if you sold that whole corner off to somebody else, well, that would be a whole different story. It wouldn't be a functional operation. So that ties it into the farming operation. And I think that's about as clear as we can get it here. So I think I'd strongly support this amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jones. (Visitor introduced.) On with discussion of Senator Baker's amendment. Senator Raikes, followed by Senators Stuhr, Landis, Stuthman, and Hartnett. Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. Senator Baker, if I could ask you a couple of questions to clarify here. As I understand this, this amendment would have really nothing to do with the part of a farmstead that includes the house, the residence, and one acre around it. Is that correct?

SENATOR BAKER: For the most part. We're eliminating that one acre out of there. That's not in here anymore. We've taken that out.

SENATOR RAIKES: So this...that's called the farm home site.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: And what we're talking about here is the farm site, which excludes the farm home site. Is that correct?

SENATOR BAKER: I think you have it right. I think I understand what you're saying. Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. So the issue is, you go from the edge of that one-acre residence area to the first field, and whatever is
