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FLOOR DEBATE

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SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. That's the only question. I just wanted to make sure that we were on the same page on the entire proposition. So with that, I'll return the rest of my time back to the Chair.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Baker, your light is next.

SENATOR BAKER: After...thank you, Mr. Speaker. After all this discussion, I'm going to withdraw the amendment. We'll just...I would ask that we advance the bill. We've had a good discussion here. But I...as we've been discussing, it's hard to explain something in an amendment that really doesn't do anything they're not supposed to be doing already. So I guess I'm going to withdraw the amendment, say I trust the assessors to get this done. And if there's a problem crops up, we'll be back. And we might even be back as soon as Select File. With that, Mr. Speaker, I'd withdraw AM0104, please.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Baker, you're asking to withdraw the amendment?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, I am, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Any objections? Seeing none, the amendment is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further on the bill at this time.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Stuthman, your light is next.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Chair and members of the body, I do not have any more comments now, because I think what has been taking place is the right direction to go, because I truly believe it's interpretation of the existing law by our assessors and what they are using. I think what we have already is okay, and I think it should be followed. And I thank you.
