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is doing...is asking that these mandates be implemented and be...some of these mandates have to be done by January of 2004, it is incumbent upon us to set up a fund to receive the federal monies that are expected to implement these mandates. And to the best of my knowledge at this point, there will be \$5 million in early money, and then there is the potential for about \$23 million in additional funds at a later date. So what this bill does is it takes a fund that's already in statute, called the Election Administration Fund, which basically is for voter regis...or, I'm sorry, the Voter Registration Cash Fund, which is mainly for doing voter registration, and renaming it the Election Administration Fund. And the fund shall be able then to accept federal funds, state gifts, grants appropriated by the administration of elections, and it will be able to be used to include voting systems, provisional voting, computerized statewide voter registration list, voter registration by mail, and other costs relating to elections that are, as I mentioned, contained in the three bills that we are going to be taking up soon. This bill does include an emergency clause, because it is conceivable that some of those monies will come in while we are yet in session. And this is that bill that I referred to, Senator Chambers, the other morning as a "no-brainer." I think it is. But you never know on this floor. So with that, Mr. Chairman, I'd be...or, Mr. Speaker, I'd be happy to try to answer any questions.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schimek. (Visitors introduced.) Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members, I'd like to ask Senator Schimek a question. And I'll admit, this is a little bit off the cuff. I haven't had a chance...will this Election Administration Fund, within the State Treasurer's Office, will that be subject to appropriations, or will that be an in-house...?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That is within the Secretary of State's Office, I believe.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well...oh, it says...oh, to the State Treasurer for credit to the Election Administration Fund.
