SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And it will be under control of the Secretary of State?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Correct.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Is that subject to appropriation? I'll admit, I'm just skimming over this.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: The way we've structured the three bills that are going to follow is that there will be almost no General Fund appropriations, that if in fact the federal government doesn't come forward with the money that we think is going to come forward, then we won't implement those bills. It says, there shall be no General Funds used. The only exception is, in one bill there's a \$2,200 administrative thing for some up-front expenses, and in another one there's a...I think it's a \$7,500. But otherwise, no. We don't want to get us in that position. Now, I should clarify what I said on the floor a minute ago. It's a total of \$23 million, not an additional \$23 million to that \$5 million. So that's what we're anticipating. But the federal government hasn't actually passed that bill. And I presume it's the omnibus bill. They haven't actually done that yet. So we'll see what they come up with.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm going to look into this a little more before we get to Select. And I want you to know, I don't have a problem. There's no fiscal note, and there probably shouldn't be. But I'm still not clear about the oversight of this, if there is any, dah dah dah.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, it's my understanding it would be the Secretary of State's Office.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I understand.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: But many times we do oversight even federal
