SENATOR HUDKINS: Because if it does change then the number that is unique to you is no longer relevant.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Let me think about that a little bit, because I'm not sure I know how to answer that just at the moment.

SENATOR HUDKINS: All right. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Hudkins. Chair recognizes Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, Senator Schimek, could I ask you a question, Senator Schimek?

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes. Please.

SENATOR HARTNETT: You mentioned handicap, I think, in your conversation with Senator Raikes. Do the voting places have to be handicap accessible?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: According to the Americans with Disabilities Act, yes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Are they? (Laugh) Don't...maybe you don't want to answer. (Laugh)

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I actually said in a previous conversation that I don't believe they all are.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Oh.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And that will be one of the things that we will be able to do with this money, is maybe help some of these counties. You know, we've got some counties out there that have very sparse populations and they have, I believe, polling places that would not maybe meet the standards,...
