would have to build up over the years before someone else could do it, and that's the problem I have now. SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, if you...I mean, just to give you an example, when it comes time for a new convention center for Lincoln, which time is coming, not this year or the next year but not too far down the line, it will probably cost in the neighborhood of 80 to 100 million dollars, you know, one perspective on it. I don't know how the fund would accumulate if first-class cities are taking \$500,000 hunks out of it. Just takes two of them in any one year and you always have the fund gone. So I guess we need to maybe work out something that looks at short term and long term.
