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state in the business of joint funding of convention...small convention centers, if I can use that description, around the state, projects which to date have not been begun. I voted against this in committee because...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...it doesn't seem to me prudent for the state at this time to be supporting convention centers that are not yet underway, there's been no commitment, around the state. We can maybe agree or disagree on whether or not it was wise in the first place to do this project in this manner in Omaha, but it seems to me at this point is a reasonable place to say, no, it would be nice but we simply don't have the money now to do this kind of thing. So, again, my comments are a little bit off the target of this bill because this bill limits the amount of money that any one project could receive. My point is that we probably should place the cap at zero. We simply should not be doing this kind of thing, and we ought to make it clear now...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...to those who might apply for grants that the state will not, will not support it; we don't have the money to do that.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm sorry. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, members of the body, I supported the issue in committee, but I forget one figure. Senator Janssen, is there any money in the fund, and what's the prospects of money in this fund? Are we chasing a dream?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Hartnett,...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah.
