haven't even done it yet, but as I add up about the first five years of Senator Janssen's figures I get something under \$2 million, or around \$2 million, if you go out five years it's almost \$3 million, a significant amount in the scheme of things, and then in another way it's an insignificant amount in the scheme of things in terms of the size of our budget. Part of the dilemma that I've mentioned to many of you and out in the public is to whether this is the third year out of a four-year problem, or a third year out of a ten, and I guess none of us know that answer. But one of the things that I would...that is toyed with and I think (inaudible)...some...another senator suggested it, I don't know whether he wants his name used yet or not, but is perhaps a moratorium on this, on this funding. Has nothing to do directly with the amendment, but it does...might...something we might want to think about waiting two or three years before that money is available. I don't know how active the grant applications are, I don't know those answers, but it wouldn't take away, at this point, from that. This is something that, say, two or three million could go into the Cash Reserve to sit there, for example, if we really are on the verge of disaster, in a sense as we are in the next three or four years. Since no one has applied, it does make it...on the other hand, I understand. And I don't want to apply humor but, Senator Baker, you used...I think you're from the "Desert District," is that what you said the other day? I don't want to treat that lightly, but perhaps that's the only activity that some of these rural communities may have is to entice people to come to rural Nebraska over the next few years. It may be the only economic activity that will be generated in those towns, will be something that they can generate to attract statewide conventions, if you will, or whatever they have in mind. I'm not sure, so I guess I'm waffling here as to what the best answer is for this particular fund. But I think maybe as time goes along we could consider as to whether we were...
