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Human Services. So that would increase \$10. The \$10 fee is to help the department keep track of what's going on out there.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay.

SENATOR SCHROCK: A lot of paperwork involved.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So this is to help monitor?

SENATOR SCHROCK: This is to help monitor where our wells are, how many there are, how much they pump. And of course, like I said, part of the fee goes for decommissioning of wells.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members. Senator Schrock, ...may I ask Senator Schrock a question?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Did you say all private wells? I was look...under...

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, when you drill...yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...even under 50 gallon, right?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes. When you drill...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: But I...but that does not...breaking the seal does not impact on private wells, would that...?

SENATOR SCHROCK: No.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's all I wanted to be sure...I was pretty sure, but I thought, I'm going to ask a silly question, in case. It's only for public water supply.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Right.
