SENATOR VRTISKA: ...since it appears, from all the material that I have, and I don't know if Senator Schrock has something different, but nobody has yet, as I understand it, determined fully whether these are legal hogs or not. And that, I guess, is the key question. Senator Schrock, do you have any response?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Vrtiska, my limited knowledge of the situation is, there are several species of wild boars. There's a Eurasian boar, and there's the razorbacks that you see in southern...in the southern part of our country, which, by the way, some of our southern states spend a lot of money trying to eradicate. But of course, you know, in Missouri you can hunt wild pigs the same as you'd hunt a coyote. They're considered to be a pest. So...but there have been litters of pigs seen on his property. Wild piglets, I guess you would want to call them. And so Game and Parks has become very concerned. I would also point out to you, Senator Vrtiska,...

SPEAKER BROMM: Time. Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. Senator Schrock, would you respond to a question, please?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes.

SENATOR JENSEN: I have...and it's not a new language, it's in existing language, in Section 2 (sic--3), subparagraph (2). And I will read that. It says: the issuance of a hunting permit to anyone known who is physically and mentally unfit to carry or use firearms is prohibited. If I came up with some language between now and Select File that I think would be more appropriate...I think this is the only place in statutes, on a quick check, that I see "physically or mentally unfit". I think that really deserves some clarification, and maybe a better description. I don't know how the Game and Parks are
