SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Vrtiska, how much money, by way of checkoff, would be considered successful in your view?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, we'll hoping that it will be at least \$50,000.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If it's less than that it would not be a successful program. Is that your view?

SENATOR VRTISKA: No, I wouldn't say it's not successful. I'd just say that the people haven't got all the word yet and haven't...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Forty thousand, would that be successful?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Oh, yeah, I think so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Less than \$40,000...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...would not be? Thirty-nine thousand would not be?

SENATOR VRTISKA: (Laugh) I don't want to answer your question because I don't think it's...I think it's irrelevant about the amount of money because of the amendment we put up, will take care of whatever costs are.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I thought money was the only relevant factor here. And you can see by the way Senator Vrtiska is hedging that he knows this is not going to work. He's throwing it up in the air, hoping that, at the location that this thing will go in the air, the law of gravity will be temporarily repealed and it will stay up there. It won't. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I hope others will vote against the advancement of this bill.
