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body. I have visited in the lobby with several people about this bill, and certainly understood the need for licensing fees to go up and the fact that they were actually self-imposed. And I certainly supported that concept. But Senator Cudaback...I would like to address several questions, if I could, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Cudaback?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'll try to answer hem.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you. Senator, on page 17, there are a number of inspection fees that are being raised here. Now, these are fees that would be paid by other people rather than members of the profession. Is that correct?

SENATOR CUDABACK: That's true.

SENATOR REDFIELD: All right. We're looking at...in line 6, it says that the fee for the first reinspection required as a result of a correction order goes from \$15, becomes \$50; and then on in the same paragraph, that a second reinspection would go actually from \$20 to \$75. Is that correct? Am I reading it?

SENATOR CUDABACK: That's true.

SENATOR REDFIELD: That's true. Then in the next paragraph, starting on line 13, the minimum fee goes from \$10 to \$30. So it triples?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Right.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Yes. And then the hourly rate, in line 17, goes from \$25 per hour to \$47. And they also can charge mileage and other expenses on top of that, correct?

SENATOR CUDABACK: True.

SENATOR REDFIELD: All right. Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I am extremely concerned about that. That seems like a very sizeable increase when you're talking about tripling rates,
