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to thank you, Senator Cudaback, for bringing this bill, and just...and let you know that I support LB 126. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Synowiecki. Senator Janssen, your light is next.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Madam Chairman. Senator Jones, you bring up a good idea there. But I'm not too sure that I'd want a nail bender wiring my house, I'll tell you that. You know, they're good carpenters. But as far as wiring, no, they don't have the expertise. But what happens here is, when you construct a new house, you hire the carpenter to come in, and you sublet the electrical work out to a licensed electrician. By law, that licensed instruction is...or, electrician is going to do the best job he knows how, because he knows that you're going to have to have an inspector come in and inspect that service. And when he does, he inspects it up to code. There's a charge for that. You can't...I had a new...if you put a new service in, also. I had a new service put into my store. The contractor did a fine job, the electrical contractor did a fine job of wiring it. And he knew he had to do a good job because the inspector...on new services, you have to have the state inspector come out. Had to wait quite a while, because those guys are awful busy. There's a lot of new construction going on. When he came there, yes, the contractor had done a great job. So he passed it. He gave us a few pointers that we couldn't have certain materials sitting by that entrance box. But that's...you know, that's the way it works. And another thing. They're not going to let that reserve get up too high. Because they know what kind of fees we are in here. We'll be tapping into that reserve too. So they're going to let that go about so high. We need...but we do need to have some money there for these people to operate. So that...I hope you can understand now what I'm talking about. So, Senator Jones, would you answer a question, please?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Jones?
