February 5, 2003 LB 14, 15, 295

Baker. Thank you, colleagues.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I rise, having just voted for the amendment, to again vote for LB 295. What Senator Baker has done is to accomplish two ends: to get us back to a comparable sales-driven assessment for farm sites and, secondly, he's improved on that formula, the standard, the benchmark we go back to, but he's improved by making clearer how that benchmark will be carried out. And for that I think we should have some gratitude, as certainly I do, and I'm going to intend to vote for LB 295. It goes back to the comparable sales standard and it clarifies what those comparable sales are, and we will be improved on both of those scores by passing LB 295.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Landis. Further discussion? Seeing none, you've heard the motion. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 295. All those in favor please say aye. Those opposed nay. Bill is advanced. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, I move the advancement of LB 14 to E & R for engrossing.
