remote sellers. That's a good thing, assuming that the project reaches its completion and the remote sellers sign up, as Senator Landis pointed out. He laid it out very clearly there are people out there who want to remit the tax if, as, and when this is all put together. This will increase uniformity with...throughout the policy, and we all can understand in a theoretical and global sense how good it will be if we can make tax policy more uniform. But I think a fair reading of the bill, and I'll, at other points in time, certainly want to hear from Senator Landis in this in response to questions or on his own direct support, I think there's no question but a reading of the bill indicates that it will significantly reduce our flexibility to adopt unique language in drafting exemptions. Now, if we didn't have seven single-spaced pages of exemptions (laugh), probably be all right. But we are where we are, and we need to go wherever we need to go, and it's proves...or is proving to be a very difficult path this session, and the concept of turning over to this great gray mass of uniformity in this project, turning over our flexibility, our individual ability to structure our tax base is not particularly appealing to me.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Just not the direction I want to go. Apparently, based on the language of the bill, any deviation from the agreement language precludes our ability to enter into agreements with the remote sellers. Well, I don't think any of us want to be in a position where we go along to get along, then, when we get there, we find that we have unintentionally precluded ourselves from lots of individualized items or opportunities which we believe would be in our best interest. Now let me give you something a little less theoretical, all this...this has been a theoretical discussion, and something very specific you can hook right into. This bill, as we read it, Senator Landis, will, correct me if I'm wrong, adopt a very narrow definition,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...to give you a specific.
