\$10 million question. So when you sign up so that if, as, and when the project comes to fruition and all the states agree and everybody joins and the remote sellers decide to pay, if all that happens, probably fine, great result. But, in the meantime, if you decide to just kind of ignore the details and sign up and do it now and be obligated and committed to the end result, if, as, and when you ever get there, you are saying we'll forego \$10 million on snack food revenue. I use that as an illustration. Now, mind you, does that mean everybody has already decided to forego that? No. Remember, there are 28 states in the United States of America that tax food, so they don't care whether you use a broad or a narrow definition of snack foods because they're already taxing them for the benefit of their people. We aren't. They don't care. Twenty-eight states don't care that this is kind of like handing over your tax policy to a compact. Let's see, low-level nuclear waste...this is asking a whole group of people with a very diverse and broad interest to decide how we're going to proceed. I caution you again, obviously I'm having fun with with the subject, but I think that what I'm relating is true. I'm not rising in opposition. I'm trying to get us to focus and to care, to listen to Senator Landis, to be certain what we're doing and not end up with an unintended consequence. Very specifically, I would urge that we slow this down. I have some thoughts in mind as to what I mean by slow it down and I'd like to develop those with Senator Landis or anybody else. But don't we want to wait...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...awhile before we adopt this language until we make a decision as to what other changes we want...might want to make this session? That doesn't mean we're not going to advance it from General File to Select, but maybe we want to have a sense of our timing and what we're giving up and where we're going. I think there's some questions that we need to pursue, and I think I'll ask these in question form and then just lay them out and we'll see where the discussion goes. What's the likelihood that a significant number of remote sellers will sign up and participate in the Streamlined Agreement? I think we need to ask that question? What's the
