instance, I have one retailer that constantly says, I buy all of the wallpaper books that are in the store, people come in, they look, they pick out the pattern, and then they blatantly tell her that, we're going to go home and order it on...over the Internet so we don't have to pay the sales tax. I think this has been long coming. I don't understand all of the details of the bill. I have a great deal of faith that the people that are representing us in this area will do a very good job in representing our interests. And I do support the bill. Senator Landis, could you answer a question, please?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Landis.

SENATOR STUHR: Could you just review that process again? Is it ten states that have to pass legislation?

SENATOR LANDIS: Ten states, comprising 20 percent of the population of the country, would be enough to initiate the operation. There are 38 states now. At the time of the hearing we were talking about 31, but at least in the material that I saw just today, perhaps the number is up to 38, have been working on the streamline project. So we would anticipate that this will happen relatively quickly.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay. Good. Thank you. I have one section, also, if you might look at Section 55. And maybe you don't have to do it right this minute, but sometime I...it has to do with water, irrigation, manufacturing, to include water for irrigation and manufacturing. Sometime I'd like a little bit of an explanation on that section, if possible. With that, I will close now, and give the rest of the time back. But I would urge the body to support this bill. Thank you.
