Nevada, because they rely very heavily on the sales tax. I think Senator Beutler has phrased a fair question when he says, on the tax policy, won't we be beholden to the streamline project at the point at which we're collecting \$50 million of sales taxes under its auspices? And the answer is, yes. Understand, we're not collecting a dime of that sales tax today. We don't have the means to collect it. Our laws are ineffective to collect it. We may be owed it, on our books, but it is not a rule we can enforce. Every dime of that \$50 million would be found money, and there is no other way to get to it. Would we be beholden? I think we would. On the other hand, I think we should be a little beholden to somebody who is allowing us to collect \$50 million of taxes that we cannot now get to. You're right. I'd want to stay in the streamline project. It's a big motivation. But my sovereignty at this point isn't able to reach that \$50 million. And by the way, current estimates are, there's about \$40 million of Internet sales going on right now, and by 2011, the University of Tennessee tells us, in a state like Nebraska that number will be \$200 million worth of taxes. I'm sorry, that's taxes, not...that's not the total amount of purchases; that's the amount of taxes that could be collected. So in that sense, I would confess, ten years down the road, when the streamline project is going to be responsible for getting us to collect 30, 40, 50 million dollars, we will think twice before we would dispute them. However, I got to tell you, that will be 30 or 40 or 50 million dollars we cannot otherwise get. And it's why I'm willing to make the trade, if there is such a trade. And I think it's a good idea.
