retail outlet or a wholesale outlet in Virginia Beach, Virginia, if Virginia is a member of this coalition, I order a pair of sunglasses from a dealer in Virginia Beach; they look up at the tax rate, that company who are there look at Nebraska's tax rate, say it's 5 percent, they will charge that applicable tax to the invoice, bill you for that amount, remit the tax to the state of Nebraska. Is this the simplicity of this bill, Senator Landis?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you respond, Senator Landis?

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes. Remember that what we're talking about is not whether Virginia has passed this rule,...

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's right.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...but whether the sunglass company has chosen to voluntarily comply. And there are a couple of reasons why they would so. But if that sunglass company is in Virginia and they've agreed to volunteer to do this, they will have some software on location, or perhaps they've got somebody who's providing it for them, and that software will handle all their intakes. And they get a Nebraska order, and the software will say, oops, tax applies to this. Print out the invoice, apply the tax for the state of Nebraska, put it on your code, keep it for the quarterly report. Quarterly report comes, send the state of Nebraska tax department a check for blah-blah-blah, blah-blah. All the Nebraska sales done in that quarter with (inaudible) tax, the software will tell them what to do, and they will comply in that way. It will be that simple.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Landis. I think that maybe this will help some of you in deciding...I don't know if anybody is going to vote against this. I certainly am not. When I heard it in committee I thought it was the best thing that we have come across yet. Because, yes, we are losing a lot of revenue off the Internet. And it's going to do nothing else but get worse. And I think the rest of the states are going to fall in line. Maybe we're a little late, but better late than never. So I ask you to advance this particular bill to Select File. Thank you.
