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it. The family can't deal with it in that moment. They simply can't deal with it, and we lose some organs that would be of vital interest and help to somebody else. It would be so helpful for me, as a chaplain, to say to them your father has...ahead of the death, your father has requested this and we will be honoring that, is there anything that you'd like to talk about, rather than to ask them for their permission or for their final decision. We need to humanize the system as well as get the organs. The present system really puts a family in a bind and creates some tensions that they're not able to deal with at that moment. Thank you.

SENATOR ENGEL: Thank you, Senator Kruse. The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator...maybe Senator Thompson knows the answer. It has to do with that information which a person is requested to give at the time of applying for a driver's license or a state identification card. Somebody told me that there is no provision on there that lets a person know that giving this information is voluntary. I'd like to ask Senator Thompson, if she knows, whether or not there is a requirement that a person be informed that this information does not have to be given, any form given along that line does not have to be filled out? I just don't know.

SENATOR ENGEL: Senator Thompson, would you respond?

SENATOR THOMPSON: I don't know, but I'll get on that and get back to you. I don't remember.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm not going to take time on this bill or try to hold it up. If somebody feels that their old sin-cursed body, after they have shuffled it off, can be of value to somebody else, or a part of it, they should be free to do with what is theirs as they please. So I'm not going to have anything to say in opposition to the bill, but I was distressed to see how people are very upset, outraged and angered that a female inmate at York, who needs a transplant, I don't remember if it was a liver, but the medical people, for people's
