is what? Croak. This information, if I understand it correctly, and it's kind of hazy in my mind because I haven't researched this or even thought about it in a long time, agencies that deal in transplantation, and maybe others, are notified when a person signs as a donor. And I'd like to ask, is there anybody who knows whether that is indeed the case? I'd like to ask Senator Kruse a question.

SENATOR ENGEL: Senator Kruse.

SENATOR KRUSE: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Kruse, is that information passed on when a person agrees on the license or the identification card to be a donor?

SENATOR KRUSE: No. The law requires the hospital staff to notify the organ donation of any time when a family member has agreed to something, but otherwise they don't know about it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So there is no repository where a listing of those who have agreed to be donors exists. Is that what I'm understanding you to say?

SENATOR KRUSE: That would be my understanding; certainly not through the license.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think it would be impractical, and by that let me say this. Do you think it would be impossible to notify license holders in Nebraska of this change in the law so those who may have had in mind that their family would agree to it after they had gone on...

SENATOR KRUSE: Senator, I've been puzzling that thought back here as I hear your thought, which is certainly a reasonable one to ask. The most feasible way I can think of to do that would be through the press, just to make it very clear that this law has been changed, since there is no listing, anywhere that I know of, of those who have signed.
