SENATOR CUDABACK: Was that a question, Senator Beutler?

SENATOR BEUTLER: No.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Quandahl.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Yes, just to try to address Senator Beutler's question somewhat, I'm not aware of this 8th Circuit case. I'm not sure exactly what the import of that was. The import of this particular bill is just for licensees that are under the direction of the Nebraska state Department of Banking and Finance, and so what this is meant to address are practices that are done within the confines of the state of Nebraska by the licensees of the state Department of Banking and Finance. And so I will try to find out a little bit more about the case that Senator Beutler has mentioned to see if there is any sort of import for the state of Nebraska. Right now, I don't think that there is, but if there isn't I will notify the body at that time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Quandahl. Senator Quandahl, there are no further lights on. You may close on the advancement of LB 218, if you care to.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Yes, thank you, Senator Cudaback. Again, LB 218 was heard before the committee on January 27, 2003. It was advanced unanimously by all members present at that time for consideration on General File here today, and I would urge the advancement to Select File of LB 218.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the closing on the advancement of LB 218. The question for the body is, shall LB 218 be advanced to E & R Initial? All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on advancement of LB 218 to E & R Initial. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 218.
