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December 2000 information that is on our desk here. It's not current. As pointed out by a former county commissioner, these comprehensive development plans are counties that have adopted, on a temporary basis, another county's zoning regulations. They are currently working through this. Looking through this, I know that some of them that are listed as comprehensive development plans are zoned now. So this information is well over two years old. And I know from my personal experience that my local county, it is zoned. And it says it is. But this isn't current information. I can't say anything more than that. I think there are three counties, Platte County, that's not zoned. I believe it's Nuckolls County. I just got this. Platte County, Nuckolls County, and I'm not sure what the third one that's not zoned at this present time. But I'm using NACO as a source out here. And we're going to check on that again, but...to make sure that we're talking correctly, or speaking correctly here. But this information...you recall, there was a window of opportunity in there to adopt interim zoning. A lot of counties did that, in a rush to get something in place, about the time these statistics here were compiled. So we'll try and clarify that further. I know there aren't 17 counties that aren't zoned. There may be more than three that are not zoned, that are still in, you know, there may be some interim zoning yet. I don't know that. But we'll get that information. Certainly, I'd like to advance the bill to Select File. And maybe we can determine just exactly what they are. We may have it here before the debate ends on this. But once again, Senator Vrtiska points out very clearly that this is a matter of jurisdiction. And local people make the best decisions, not Department of Roads driving up and down in their vehicles saying, well, this is a problem junkyard. Local people know when somebody is building a junkyard. I have some experience in my local county, home county there, with this, and they...to be honest with you, the zoning board is handling it very well. It's an issue that there's apparently a junkyard being developed, or filled, that has no permit to do so. And they're taking care of the matter. So that's local control at its best. With that, we will try and get the correct counties here that are zoned and not zoned. It's very minor. And as I said, this sheet that's passed out here with several people's initials on it is over two years old, and I don't think it's correct. Thank
