From your experience as a county, does a county charge to inspect the junkyards? In the...it says, junkyards are currently required to obtain an annual permit at the cost of \$50. And I think the state was trying to get out of that business of...because they're not on the Interstate, I think, as I read the bill. Does the counties then charge...since they're going to be doing this if this bill passed, would they start charging the junkyards to inspect them? I'm just raise...you know.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: The way I understand this is that the counties would be able to charge. But this would be all defined in the comprehensive plan as far as inspections, regulations or renewals of permits. That would all be defined in the comprehensive plan. And that comprehensive plan would be developed by the people of the zoning commission as they have their hearings, as to what they want that fits their county.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So every county would do...could do it differently?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: It's very possible that between counties it could vary from \$5 to \$50 to \$100, depending upon what they decide would be a realistic figure for the amount that it needs to have for the inspection. But that would be because of the planning commission. They would decide that, and they would get their information from the hearing process.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Hartnett, Senator Stuthman. Senator Cudaback, your light is next.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I call the question.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Cudaback has called the question. Do I see five hands? I do. The question then before us is whether we should call the question. All in favor please vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.
