SENATOR THOMPSON: Because it hasn't been brought against an individual ever, to my knowledge, in my research of this. I think what happens is, law enforcement may be called, and they talk to the person, and they just comply. The bigger issue is with establishments that don't comply with the law.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Are we kind of passing feel-good legislation? Is that...

SENATOR THOMPSON: Pardon me?

SENATOR THOMPSON: No, it's...this is an issue that has been brought by not only the local level, but at the state level, to me, for several years, that you go to...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...to the establishment, and you say, these...this is the law, and largely they comply, or they get written up and then they comply. But you have no teeth to say, well, if you don't comply, there's no penalty.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I see. So this puts the penalty in there.

SENATOR THOMPSON: This puts a penalty in.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Class V.

SENATOR THOMPSON: It makes our law enforceable.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Thank you, Senator Thompson.
