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the Legislature. I don't want to just keep going back over the same thing again and again, and I do...so I don't want to waste a lot of time on this. Senator Byars did an excellent job of pointing out the issue. Essentially, this is the law. It's been the law for a long time. It just...this particular committee amendment reduces the bill to one section that says that the law is enforceable, not only against the smoker, but against the establishment. They're already required to do this. This is the law. Most places comply with the law. This is to get to those that want to ignore what the current law is, merely because there's no penalty attached. And if you want to know what currently is the law, you can look to earlier pages of the bill to see that. For example, the proprietor is supposed to make reasonable efforts to prevent smoking in a public place by posting appropriate signs, arranging seating to provide a smoke-free area, asking smokers to refrain from smoking upon request of a client or employee suffering discomfort from the smoke, or any other means. So that's what they're already required to do. Most establishments want to comply with the law. But there are...it makes it difficult for local health departments and local law enforcement and the state to be able to get to those that choose to ignore the law. So this is just putting this law in the same context that we do other laws when we pass them. It puts an enforcement piece in the law. And thank you. I hope you'll support the bill.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Thompson. Senator Cunningham, you are recognized to speak. You're waiving? Senator Cunningham waives. Senator Janssen, your light is on.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Just a few statements, you know. You'll always have...you're always going to have people that are going to come into an enclosed established, especially restaurants, who will, for nothing else, just for spite, try to violate these types of ordinances, and problems that we have. That's always going to happen. But then you'll also have people who will sit there and try to find something wrong. So it's a...it's kind of a no-win situation for some of the proprietors in these eating...especially in eating establishments, you know. And some people have very sensitive noses, and they don't like smoke. I'm not sure they'd
