think that I'm going to vote no on this, unless I can be convinced that my concerns are unwarranted. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Stuthman, you are recognized to speak.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Madam...Senator, and members of the body. The thing that really concerns me with this bill, in the sentence where it has the local health board. In my opinion, the local health boards in the past have not been very active. But since we have received this tobacco money and have developed these district health departments, I think they have become more active. It seems to me that if there's more people involved and more people looking at this, an individual can go to these health departments with a problem of asthma or anything like this. That group would see it fit to file an injunction, or file a suit against certain individuals. And I'm really uncomfortable with this, just because of what has been taking place in the past years, as making people more aware of it. And the departments, individuals can go to that department and file a complaint to that department, and that department has got the right to move ahead with it, or if they don't want to. But more people involved will have more consequences. So I'm a little bit uncomfortable at this time. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator. Is there further debate on the issue? Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Senator Schimek, members of the Legislature. I rise mainly for one purpose, and that's to allow the discussion that's going on on the side to continue. And hopefully from that there will be some type of resolution to some of this. I think Senator Bourne brings up a valuable point, and that is, is that the goal, I believe, at least my intent, of enforcing the law, is not to the point where you have individuals who will run the state and seek to get people, essentially, for what they're doing in the best effort to comply with the law. And I just...you know, I struggle with the part...granted, it's in existing law...that says, any affected party. And I think anything that we can do to clarify that would be of value, I think, not only to the credibility of the
