SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith, you have almost five minutes.

And we're talking about constitutional language here. And, either Senator McDonald, Senator Schimek, do we list out each political subdivision in the constitution?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you. First of all, a political subdivision has the power to tax. Would you agree? Political subdivision...
