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consequences, now we've got to go back to the people again and ask them again to fix it. Well, if we mess up a law, if we mess up a statute and we come back and say, oh, well, we had an oversight and we just need a cleanup bill, we can argue about that, we can do that on a yearly basis around here and that's not a problem. But if we ask the people, hey, we've done our homework, we've done our work, we've figured out all the legal ramifications and we as a Legislature feel this is the most appropriate response for a problem that we see in Nebraska law, I think that's what we need to have a discussion about. And I'm glad that we are. So I just rise to say, there's a lot of questions that I feel need to be answered. And I'm going to be listening to hear the discussion. But again, I'm going to be one of those people that says, you know what, if we're going to send this before the people, we better have all the answers, we better have a really good, compelling reason to change the constitution. So that is my thoughts, my comments, and I look forward to further discussion. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members of the body, I too have some questions. And I probably...I missed your introduction, Senator McDonald. I'd like to...Mr. Speaker, I'd like to ask Senator McDonald a question, if I may.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator McDonald, would you yield to a question from Senator Wehrbein?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator McDonald, I missed your initial...and I apologize for that. I was distracted momentarily. Would you explain the reason for the introduction of this? So, maybe that will get us back on the basic reason for introducing this, and if there's a practical explanation, or that we can use, understand.

SENATOR McDONALD: Well, this just amends the section, Article IV, Section 1 of the constitution, that says...what it does, it just clarifies that an employee of a political subdivision of the state is not holding an elected office...excuse me, an executive office, and is not an executive
