Because, I mean, putting something on the ballot is a serious issue. And I trust the voters to make the right decision. However, I don't want to put something on the ballot if it isn't necessary. Yes. I yield to Senator Schimek for a response.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Smith, I agree with you, you know, 100 percent. I don't want to clutter up the constitution either. And I don't want to put something on the ballot that the voters are going to be confused about and think is a bad idea. And maybe, maybe this discussion we're having this morning is all we have to do. Or maybe what Senator Chambers is suggesting, that we pass a statute, is all we have to do. But I think if we take either of those actions and leave it at that, the questions are still there. And what this particular provision does is it states very clearly that it doesn't apply to political subdivisions, that the Conway decision...
