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commission, or other public entity, to fulfill their requirement by presenting a report through electronic means, through a gateway which the State Records Board has. They have to notify the Clerk of the Legislature. They have to make a copy available to you in paper if you request it. But in fact, it will save our trees, and it certainly will save our offices from the clutter that accumulates as we do so. I think this is just efficiency in government. It's recognizing that times have changed, and that in fact it might be easier to turn to that piece on your PC, rather than having to dig through a file cabinet to find that report you don't remember where you filed. So if there are any questions, I would be happy to address them. I think this is just efficiency in government. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Senator Dwite Pedersen.

SENATOR DW. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. I fully endorse this. I cannot believe, since I've been in the Legislature, the stuff that comes through our offices. And I for one want to tell you, there is not more than 10 percent of the stuff that comes to my office that I've been able to read. Even if I were a speed reader, I couldn't read more than 30 percent of it. Pamphlets come in more books and more binders, and some of the fanciest pictures. Have any of you been by a Kinko's lately and asked for a color-copied picture, and see what it costs? These books come full of it, full of it. And we're paying for that. There's got to be not just hundreds and thousands of dollars, but I would bet close to millions of dollars spent on this stuff that isn't getting read anyway. This makes sense, and I fully support it. Thank you.
