SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Kearney has an occupation tax, as well as the 2 percent tax, and then there is the 1 percent state tax, giving a total of 5 percent, and that is the maximum that our community has any desire to do. Basically, what I'm supporting is the possibility of other states along...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would waive for the moment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler waives off. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, that comment from Dr. Johnson is reassuring. I'm wondering, though, just what kind of tourist attractions people envision being funded by this money, so if he will not take all of my time, I'd like to ask Senator Beutler if he can give me just an example or two of tourist attractions that will be funded by this money which otherwise would not be,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...if you have any.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, when you talk, Senator, about what would not otherwise be, right now none of the lodging tax money can be used to build physical facilities. It can be used only for
