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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could there be, as a manifestation of culture, various dances performed there?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, I suppose so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And along the line of entertainment, could there be on the dancers displays of various types of costumes?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, there could be more elaborate or scant costumes, I suppose, within the boundaries of the law, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And Senator Beutler anticipated my next question. Anything within the bounds of the law would be entitled to this money, and that's as it should be. However, the brake on the wheel would be the county board perhaps not approving of certain types of entertainment, so they would say no. Now, under the bill that is possible, isn't it, Senator Beutler, because the county board would have to approve of the expenditure for a given project?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Absolutely...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...in every case.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Members of the Legislature, I told Senator Hartnett I'm not going to try to delay this bill, and I'm not. but I do think there are some legitimate questions that swirl around it...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and I'm not going to vote for it at this time, nor am I going to vote against it, but I'm just concerned about the attitudes of people on county boards, not just in the other parts of the state but even in Douglas County, but in Douglas County it's too late to do anything about that. That's a lost cause. But should a lost cause be spread around the state? I'm not sure. If I can be persuaded that since Douglas
