unintelligible. If something is perfect, that means it is without flaw. Everything is in its place. It cannot be improved upon. If it has a flaw, it is not perfect. The term "more" is a word that indicates a comparison is being made. On the left hand you have an object; on the right hand you have a different object. The object on the right hand possesses to a greater degree whatever it is that the object on the left hand has. So to show that relationship, you use the term "more." The object on the right hand is more sensible than the object on the left hand. Since "perfect" means without flaw, the term in the constitution's Preamble, "more perfect union,"...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...is illogical. Either the union is perfect or it is not. If it is not perfect, then you don't put the word "more" in front of it. You say, "in order to form a perfect union." So we've come across an error of the Preamble of the U.S. Constitution. Getting back to this executive order: "It is the policy of the Government of the United States to provide equal opportunity in Federal employment." I'm going to have to put my light on in order that I can continue parsing and explaining.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. On discussion of FA1161 to LB 52, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. I think in order that there will be coherence in the presenting of this Section 1 of Executive Order 11478, I should read the entire section, and then begin to parse it. "It is the policy of the Government of the United States to provide equal opportunity in Federal employment for all persons, to prohibit discrimination in employment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, handicap, age, or sexual orientation, and to promote the full realization of equal employment opportunity through a continuing affirmative program in each executive department and agency." "Each" means every one or all. Back to this executive order. "This policy of equal opportunity applies to and must be an integral part of every aspect of personnel policy and practice in the employment, development, advancement, and
