advantage of girls. We have crass people who will try to take advantage of females who are not fully grown women, nor girls, but somewhere in between. And some of these young women have to take jobs to earn money. And when they take a job, if they take a job serving the public, they should be free of discrimination, insults, fondling, and other activities that are violations of the law, violation of morality, violation of common decency. Even if a young woman puts on an outlandish costume that might make her look like a robin, a caricature of a robin, maybe somebody trying to be funny would sing, "When the Red, Red, Robin Comes Bob, Bob, Bobbin' Along." That's all right. You can sing what you want to when it's not out of line, when it's not sexually suggestive, when it's not degrading, demeaning, or debasing toward another person. There was a young lady, 17 years old, who had a job in an establishment called the Red Robin. The president of the Omaha City Council, a "Repelican," who used to head the "Repelican" party, and a person who was recently appointed to be the Douglas County election commissioner,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

But instead of him being a robin when he went to this place, he was more like a chicken hawk. Some people say "vulture" or "buzzard."
