Now, in the example that I gave of the young woman being subjected to sexual harassment at best and a criminal improper touching at worst, the matter has been turned over for investigation to the State Patrol, because the Omaha Police Division said they may have a conflict of interest. They didn't explain what it was. I don't know if it means because they had been fondling young girls. I don't know what their conflict of interest is.

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But at any rate, it was turned over to the State Patrol, the investigation of the "Red Robin caper," as some would call it, but I would call it the "Red Robin crime." What will the State Patrol do? Will they sit on it and hope it goes away? Will they produce a secret report which will never see the light of day? Will they be prevailed upon to protect these two high-ranking "Republican" officials? Only time will tell, but remember this--a robin red breast in a cage puts all heaven in a rage.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. (Visitors introduced.) And while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 29, LR 30, and LR 31. Senator Chambers, you're recognized, and this, Senator Chambers, will be your third time on this amendment, already.
