SPEAKER BROMM: Time. Thank you, Senator Chambers. (Visitors introduced.) Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the Legislature, let me read you some of those in the federal government who do not discriminate based on sexual orientation. These are the names of the employers: the Federal Emergency Management Agency, which is known as FEMA--no discrimination based on sexual orientation; the Federal Trade Commission, FTC--no discrimination based on sexual orientation. I'd like to ask Senator Redfield a question.

SENATOR SCHIMEK PRESIDING

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Redfield, would you yield?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Yes, thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I do this on purpose, Senator Redfield. Two out of the three people involved in this particular activity are females. I just want to call that to people's attention. What agency is identified by the letters GAO? What governmental office is that?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Government Accounting Office.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Or the General...General...is that the General Accounting Office?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Oh, I'm sorry. Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And I'm not going to get you in a long discussion. Did you...were you aware that they have a policy against discrimination based on sexual orientation?

SENATOR REDFIELD: I was not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And I'd invite people to listen and hear some more that have that policy: the General Services Administration, a policy against discriminating based on sexual
