not expect to persuade Senator Erdman, I don't expect Senator Foley to agree to vote to put this amendment in proper form, but I'm trying to appeal to others of my colleagues who will understand how we do legislate. This amendment has nothing to do with the underlying principle or policy that I am advocating we adopt, so I'm going to ask, Madam President, for a call of the house so that I can explain this as people come in, and I know my time will be running.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. There has been a call...or there has been a request for a call of the house and we would ask all senators...no. All in favor vote aye; all opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 1 nay to place the house under call, Madam President.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: The house is under call. Will all senators please report to the Chambers and record your presence. The house is under call. Would all senators please return to the Chamber and check in, please. Senator Cudaback, would you please report to the Chamber. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, ma'am.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I needed to recognize you again. You were going to finish closing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All I needed was enough time to say that the only thing this amendment does is to...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...change the word "resolution" to "ordinance." Villages and cities do not adopt resolutions; they adopt ordinances. My amendment says "resolution." This amendment would strike the word "resolution" and replace it with "ordinance." That's all that it does. Thank you, ma'am.
