SENATOR SCHROCK: Yeah. Senator Hartnett, right now that's kind of the problem. There is no process.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Oh, okay.

SENATOR SCHROCK: And this means, if you're going to put a wastewater system in, it has to be done by someone who is licensed to do it.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So this will start the licensing process? They have to be licensed through the state?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes. And there will be a panel, an advisory committee of people who install septic tanks, to set the standards. And they'll have to be properly engineered, and there will have to be considerations for protection of our streams and of the domestic wells in the area.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Is there any notification to the county people, or...if it's in...or within the city, if there's within three miles? Or is it just simply through the state? If I'm a county person or a city person, can I find out this information, or do I have to go to DEQ?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Right now the cities have their own standards, so this bill does not apply to those people who live within city limits.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Or outside their...how about their zoning jurisdiction, Senator Schrock?

SENATOR SCHROCK: How's that?

SENATOR HARTNETT: How about their zoning jurisdiction, their...

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well, counties have...

SENATOR HARTNETT: They control that. But how about in the counties? Is that...?

SENATOR SCHROCK: The counties also have jurisdiction.
