amendment drawn to this effect, but I'm trying to find out if anybody else engages in this. We could add these constitutional officers after the Legislature. I am not prepared to concede Senator Landis' extremely well presented point that when the people vote for the Auditor of Public Accounts, they're saying, and if we need a stand-in Governor, I want that person; or when they vote for the Attorney General to be the chief law enforcement officer of the state, they're saying, and if we have a disaster, we want this person to step into the shoes of the governorship. Sometimes Attorney Generals try to move up and don't make it. So we do have...and we can find other examples that would indicate that because the people elect you Secretary of State or Attorney General or Auditor of Public Accounts or Treasurer, for heaven's sake, to take care of the money, doesn't mean they want you to someday run the state if there's a need. So I want to be very serious in making the argument that I don't think there is any actual affirmation by all the voting people of the state of Nebraska with regard to what additional powers and duties these constitutional officers might assume. And I'm serious also when I say that I'm not interested in having this be another, quote, qualification for the office that legitimizes somebody running for one office and talking about another. I'm not interested in perpetuating that kind of politics. I come from a tradition in Nebraska where we didn't do that, and I thought maybe we were better served. And that will be disputed, I'm sure. But I think everybody ought to focus on the office that the people elected them to complete, to serve and complete and do it competently. So I think there is a serious side to this question that we ought to also think about, in terms of how this might play out, who might use it to what end, and what we might be legitimizing that we really don't want to legitimize.
