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relative to maybe a couple of alternative ways of handling this situation, number one being leave it up to the Real Estate Commission to make a determination on each applicant as to whether they should or should not be fingerprinted, I think it would be really nice if we could do that. I think you open yourself up to some liability issues of choosing, picking and choosing who does and who doesn't and I'm not sure...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BYARS: ...what your criteria would be to make that decision. I'm like you. I wish, unfortunately, that our cultural environment had not come to the place that we need to do any of this, that we could do a trust thing, that people come in, they make their application. They take their exam to show they are qualified to be a professional real estate person, and we grant them a license. Unfortunately, people have become very deceptive. People have found ways that on the surface to make themselves look quite innocent and not offensive. And we, unfortunately, here in this state have seen this same type of thing and in this industry. As we look at the Nebraska Title debacle, and there I think we go to the issue, the third question you asked, should we then be going back with present licensees and saying, hey, we need to do a background check on you also? I would hope that we wouldn't have to do that, but...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Byars.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Mr. President, and I will yield back to you also, Senator Beutler, if you want the time. I'm...again, I'm a very trusting type person. I'm one that would like to give a lot of faith in what people tell me, and I would like to think that everyone who is practicing this profession at this time is also totally...has total integrity, is somebody that can be trusted. They've been in the business now so, you know, and any problems might have already arisen. But I'm not sure that's the case, and maybe it is. Maybe, unfortunately, we're getting to this place in society where not only will we have to have a fingerprint but sometime we will have to, every one of us, be subjected to a DNA test. And where
