maybe the next step there might be to fingerprint these people. What do you think, Senator?

SENATOR BYARS: I just think that's a marvelous idea, Senator Beutler. Probably we ought to start by fingerprinting the Real Estate Commission. Don't you think that that would...do that first?

SENATOR BEUTLER: (Laugh) Yeah, we ought to go up the chain and down the chain, shouldn't we?

SENATOR BYARS: Certainly, absolutely.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The other thing I wanted to ask you about was on page 20, line 26 and 27. It indicates there that the individuals representing purchasers are going to be involved in a representational organization. And it says the purchasers in each retirement subdivision and community shall annually have the opportunity to democratically select and designate two individuals to represent the purchasers. And you would appreciate the fact that we could quibble about what democratic elections are, and I just wanted you to ask the Real Estate Commission if they wouldn't check and see if there is something a little more definite that didn't involve hopefully a gross amount of additional detail that might be somewhat less vague than simply the language "democratically" electing them.

SENATOR BYARS: Certainly, I think that's a good suggestion, Senator Beutler. In paragraph (c), it doesn't clarify completely. It does enter into it a little bit, but the entire election shall be done by the purchasers, so there would not be any influence relative to owners, managers, developers, and the entire process would be conducted by them. But let's...yes, I think that's a good suggestion. Let's look at that between now and Select File and see if we can't clean it up a bit.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank you, Senator.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Open for discussion on advancement of LB 61. Seeing nobody wishing to speak, Senator Byars, would you like to close on advancement?
