"bible" because once this is successful, which it will be eventually, then you're not going to be able to effectively withdraw from this organization. You will hear, and you've heard in debate, if we don't like what they do in this agreement we can withdraw, but once we're taking in 50, 80, 150 million dollars worth of revenue by means of this agreement, as a practical matter, withdrawal will not be a usable tool. So what then are your usable tools? Your usable tools are the people that you send there to represent you and the manner in which they represent you. Remember that the governing board of this organization, through a voting structure that is set up in this document, can not only interpret this document but it can also change this document. And so, for example, when you see in this document today, when you see in this document today that we can exempt anything we want from taxation, tomorrow that may not be so if the people we send down there to represent us, together with the required majority of other governing body representatives, if they decide this is going to change and we're going to disallow, under this new "bible," all exemptions. Now some of you may be stand up and cheering because this is a method by which things like LB 775 can come to an end. That is, we can all come to an agreement whereby we won't allow certain types of exemptions across the nation. Then we won't be whipsawed anymore. But the point here is that these people can not only interpret and administer the act, but they are the legislative body. They can change the act. And so we are putting ourselves subject to them in terms of developing legislative policy. We are subject to them, for all practical purposes. So if you want to retain the maximum amount of legislative authority that you can over these policymaking decisions, that is, a decision to change this basic tax agreement document, if you want to retain the maximum legislative authority this amendment suggests that you do two things. One, that you change the representation from two members...from two people to three people and ensure that two of those people are members of the Legislature, so that the legislative branch of government, which is the policymaking branch of government, retains, in its representation to this governing board, the majority vote with regard to policymaking decisions. So that if you adopt this amendment, instead of having one person appointed by the Legislature, you would have
