perceive the problem. And I guess I will do some more inquiry as to what kind of control we'll have into the future if we end up with a West Nile virus problem. That is my concern, about tires and other things that accumulate water. We all have those problems. But salvage yards are certainly a hotbed for that type of environment for mosquitos, and that's one of my issues that I'm concerned about, whether even the Department of Roads is the right one to do something about that. I guess I want to find more information out about what powers our health departments have and so forth. I may be a little off base here in terms of where the control should be. But I think that we potentially can have a serious problem this summer and later. Thank you.
